

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: PREPARING TO RESPOND

The Scriptures this Sunday speak of the Lord calling his



first disciples to follow him. It is good to see the Gospel, not so much as a book of beliefs to be accepted, but rather as a mission to be accomplished. We, walking together with Christ as did the first disciples,

are to be out there in the world, working to advance and move Christ's saving mission to fulfillment. We can bring good news to the poor, liberty to those bound by addictions, compulsions and guilt, and we can give the light of knowledge and vision to those who are blinded by the world's darkness. Living our Christian values more faithfully by respecting life, living in honesty and truth, establishing justice, working for peace and building up our families allows us to further Christ's mission on earth. The good Lord calls us as certainly as he called those first disciples from their boats. He calls us and sends us.

As we move through these last days of Ordinary Time, we have the Mardi Gras holidays, but they are also good days to spend a little time reflecting on how we can best spend our Lent, how we can follow a bit more closely.

FASTING IN LENT: Throughout the Scriptures, we are admonished to fast and pray. Fasting does not assure us of that which we want, and it is not a means of manipulating God for our benefit. The primary reason for fasting is that we separate ourselves from those things which capture our attention so that we might be less distracted by them and more united to (focused on) God. Fasting has, as its end goal, the deepening of our relationship with God, recognizing our need of the Lord. While fasting is generally considered to be abstinence from food, it may also involve abstinence from those things which separate us from God and minimize our ability to seek him. It might be that the fast you need to enter may not be simply from food, but from noise, television, hobbies, or other things that keep us from hearing our deepest needs. Of course, fasting should not injure your health. If you are ill or other circumstances require you to eat regularly, do that which will be best for your total health - spiritual and physical. Remember that fasting has changed the lives of many for the better through the centuries.

Fasting as a Community – This is very important and much can be said of the benefits of fasting together,

doing a penance as a community. The Bishops of the United States, recognizing this good, have issued the following Lenten regulations:

In the Diocese of Baton Rouge, as in the rest of the Church in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound by a *grave obligation* to observe a *solemn fast* on both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Catholics aged 14 and up are to *abstain from meat* on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday as well.

To fast means to consume only one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink "between meals" (excepting only water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

To abstain from meat means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry at least, although not necessarily eggs, milk products, or meat broths or condiments made from animal fat. The consumption of fish, shellfish, and reptiles (e.g., turtle, alligator) is permitted if desired. During the Lenten season, Christ Jesus' own challenges to "prayer, fasting and almsgiving" are paramount (see the Gospel reading for Ash Wednesday, Mt 6:1-6, 16-18). We seek ongoing forgiveness for sin (especially in the Sacrament of Penance) and come to appreciate ever more the great sufferings and sacrifice which Our Savior experienced for the sake of our salvation.

All priests and deacons have been delegated the power to *dispense* the faithful of the diocese, in individual cases and for a just reason, from the obligation to observe a particular day of penance, or to commute some or all of its obligations to other pious works. Included in this is the faculty to dispense from the Lenten obligations to fast and abstain from meat. Yet the obligation to do some kind of penance remains a serious one, and is not taken lightly by a good Catholic.

I hope that in these last days before Lent, we can take a bit of time to either set some goals, or plan to simplify our lives that we might get in better touch with the God who loves and calls us and how we might better live the life and Spirit God has so generously shared with us.

I would like to call to the attention of those registering youth for PSR that the registration fees have been slightly raised \$5.00 in each category, the first time fees have been raised in over fourteen years. It was necessary with rising costs of books, etc.

Let us pray for one another as we near the Lenten Season; Love,

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Next Weekend:

• February 13...Lenten Retreat for all catechumens, candidates and their godparents/ sponsors.

• February 14...Rite of Sending at 9:00 a.m. Mass. Rite of Election and Rite of Call to Continuing Conversion at 1:00 p.m. at St. Joseph's Cathedral, Baton Rouge.

What is the RCIA Rite of Election? This Rite marks a key moment. The catechumens travel to the Cathedral where the community, with godparents representing the parish, will wholeheartedly acclaim the participants' readiness. It is appropriate for the bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the particular Church, and it is the parish community's responsibility to bring those in RCIA into the fullness of the life of the Church. The godparents' role is very significant; they represent the community and are asked during this Rite to make serious statements about the catechumens. The decision of an RCIA participant to go through this Rite means that the judgement and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point ward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the "Elect". They have been chosen to enter into the final period of preparation for initiation, and called by the bishop, their shepherd, to the holy mysteries to be celebrated at Easter.

What is the RCIA Rite of Call to Continuing Conversion? For those already baptized (candidates), the reality of being chosen and claimed by Christ took place at their Baptism; they are already among the elect in Christ. They are "called to continuing conversion," and thus their intention to be fully initiated and share in the Eucharist is recognized. With their sponsors standing in support of them, the candidates are addressed by the bishop to hear the Lord's call to conversion, and together with the Elect are moved into a period of intense spiritual preparation.


